Zero Tolerance for Child Sexual Exploitation

Hotel Joshed Imperial firmly rejects any form of sexual exploitation, including the commercial sexual exploitation of children and teenagers (CSEC). We are committed to ensuring that our activities and services are never used for such acts.

Commitment to the Law

We fully comply with Ecuadorian and international laws that protect the rights of children and adolescents — including the Ecuadorian Tourism Law, the Comprehensive Organic Criminal Code (COIP), and international conventions ratified by Ecuador, such as the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child.

Shared Responsibility

All Hotel Joshed Imperial team members are trained to recognize, prevent, and take appropriate action in any situation that could involve child or adolescent sexual exploitation.

Awareness and Prevention

We continuously raise awareness among our staff and guests about the issue of sexual exploitation and human trafficking for sexual purposes, providing clear information on how to identify and prevent such situations.

Immediate Action

If any suspicious situation is identified, immediate action will be taken, and the relevant authorities will be informed as required by law.

The original signed document, along with a copy of the child's birth certificate or ID and copies of the guardian's ID, must be presented at check-in. If these documents are not provided, the hotel will not allow entry and may apply any penalties in effect for that date.
